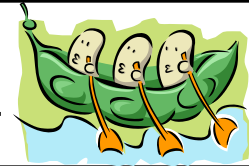

Important facts about your new contract

- The 1.9% salary cut from the state was restored.
- All employees must have a functional and efficient workstation that is equipped with the technology, including the hardware and software, to perform the duties of one's position.
- Elementary principal will schedule five minutes of passing time in between specialist classes.
- District Committee Work..specific dollar amounts were added to the contract.
- Counselor days were added to assist building administration outside of school year.
- Site-Based Council and SIP Team language clarified.
- ERS enhanced over the next five years.
- Professional Days enhanced over the next five years.
- Health Care \$\$ enhanced over the next five years
- TPEP language added and clarified.
- Certification/Licensing \$\$ of OT, PT, SLP
- Extracurricular stipend subcommittee will address future enhancements.

We are not limited in the scope of this agreement as to future dollars coming from the State. Any and all future dollars or benefits driven by the legislature will trigger an immediate re-opening of negotiations between the district an PEA.
